What will we be learning this term?

In Maths and English, the children will continue to follow the National Curriculum programmes of study for their year group.



The Key Stage Two topic is **Chocolate**, with a distinct focus on the **Mayan Civilisation**, moving onto chocolate today. Our approach to teaching our topics means that children will develop skills across all curriculum areas, for example:

Art and DT: Mayan art and making chocolate!

Music: composing and performing music that reflects the traditions of the Mayan civilisation. Children will also learn songs and perform in the end of year show!

History: Who were the Mayans? How has chocolate changed over time?

Geography: Where does chocolate come from?


If you have anything you would like to share with us to enhance our learning, we'd love to hear from you!



In science, we will continue to learn about the life cycle of plants in the first half term.

After that, we will be studying materials. In particular, we will look at the properties of solids, liquids and gases.

This includes learning about the water cycle and how materials change state through heating and cooling.
