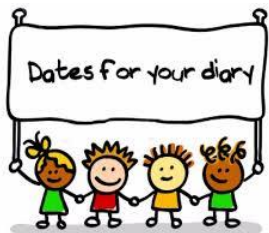

Road Safety.

Yesterday morning, Gist, a road safety company, came to talk to us about road safety since there are many busy roads around Elvington. Additionally, a 44 ton (the same weight as 76 cows) lorry came into the playground.

Gist has visited over 120,000 children in three years. Accidents occur every day and over 44,000 people are injured or even killed every year but Gist have shown us ways to stay safe on the road. Gist told us about always looking and listening out for any cars before stepping out onto the road, even if there's a green man and some cars have stopped. In order to help us learn about how to tell if we are at a safe distance, Gist told us that it takes 30 metres for a truck going at 30mph to stop. Gist also said that children not paying attention are at risk and if distracted, might make a silly mistake.

We tested to see if Miss Hewson, our teacher, could see us in the blind spots when she sat in the lorry. We stood right in front of the cab, when the engine wasn't running, and found that she could not see us. The purpose of this was to show us how the drivers a limited view point. It was very useful and we even got reflective wristbands, small lights and a Gist pencil so that vehicles can see us in the dark.
