How can you help at home?

- * Reading- Please continue to read with your child for at least 5 minutes every day and record this in their planners. Encourage lots of independent reading or the children reading aloud to younger siblings too. Remember that children have their reading bingo in their planners to encourage wider reading of genres. We would encourage a minimum of completing one reading bingo chart per term.
- Spellings- Spelling homework will be distributed every Friday with a test the following Friday.
 - <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> Please continue to encourage your child to go on Times Table Rockstars at home. As well as times tables being vital to children's mathematical progress, the Year 4 children will participate in a national online multiplication check in summer term; more information regarding this will be communicated later in the school year.
- * Homework book- Your child will be provided with a Homework Book. This half term, there will be a grid of tasks linked to the topic 'The Indus Valley', covering a range of curricular areas. Each week, your child should try to do one task from the grid and return it to school by the next Wednesday to be marked.
