### COVID-19

I will be on call every day up to and including Christmas Eve. Please inform me if your child tests positive for COVID-19 during this time, as this will enable an email to be sent to inform the relevant class bubble/s.

If your child has a positive COVID-19 diagnosis, or is having a test/required to self-isolate, please inform the school using the following email address, as soon as you find out: [head@elvingtonprimary.org.uk](mailto:head@elvingtonprimary.org.uk). The aforementioned email address will be checked regularly - seven days a week and over holidays. The school will always inform you as soon as we can if there has been a confirmed case within your child's bubble and if your son or daughter needs to isolate. However, we will never name the child/staff member who has tested positive.

We must all continue to be vigilant of COVID-19 symptoms: a new continuous cough, a high temperature or the loss of taste or smell. ## School Admissions - Final Reminder

You should apply for your child to start primary or infant school by the 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021 in the school year your child turns 4. For entry in the September 2021 school year, children will have been born between **1<sup>st</sup> September 2016** and **31<sup>st</sup> August 2017** and you can now start your application. Applications for children who were born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2017 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2018 can be made only from the autumn of 2021.


