COVID-19

As explained in this letter: <u>www.elvingtonprimary.org.uk/general/department-for-education-announcement</u>, we will not be having an INSET day on Friday 18th December (school will be open as previously planned). I will be on call every day up to and including Christmas Eve. Please inform me if your child tests positive for COVID-19 during this time, as this will enable an email to be sent to inform the relevant class bubble/s.

If your child has a positive COVID-19 diagnosis, or is having a test/required to self-isolate, please inform the school using the following email address, as soon as you find out: <u>head@elvingtonprimary.org.uk</u>. The aforementioned email address will be checked regularly - seven days a week and over holidays. The school will always inform you as soon as we can if there has been a confirmed case within your child's bubble and if your son or daughter needs to isolate. However, we will never name the child/staff member who has tested positive.

We must all continue to be vigilant of COVID-19 symptoms: a new continuous cough, a high temperature or the loss of taste or smell. If a child, or any member of their household, has any of these symptoms, however mild, they must not come to school and should seek a test as soon as possible by calling 119 or visiting: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/get-a-test-to-check-if-you-have-coronavirus/.
