I think the strengths of the school are (*a selection of the comments received*)

- The Staff are excellent. They always deliver a high level of teaching, challenging the children to achieve their best. They are caring and approachable and will act quickly to any concerns a parent may have.
- Good behaviour and social expectations of pupils. Good sense of a community. Very friendly and supportive. Very encouraging of pupils. Mr. Buttery is visible and accessible and clearly involved with the children on a day to day basis, which is a great strength.
- Communication with parents, I always feel I know what is happening 2. Being a happy environment for my children 3. Dealing quickly and effectively with any (rare) concerns, feeling listened to 4. The clear hard work and commitment of all staff 5. It's clear staff genuinely enjoy being around children.
- *Mr. Buttery has brought the school to a higher standard. He works tirelessly to ensure the children have the best possible education. What would we do without him?*
- Each child is treated as an individual and supported to do their best. Relationships between parents and carers are open and genuine.
- Nurturing ethos, approachable and professional staff.
- The headteacher, the teachers and all staff. They all make the school what it is and make learning both challenging and fun. Very supportive throughout lockdowns and in general.
- Fantastic leadership, Mr Buttery is approachable, always happy and greets each child by name on a morning. Leads the school and staff to maintain a high standard. During lockdown sent email communications late at night and after any major government announcement. He phoned parents individually just to 'check in'. Elvington are very lucky to have him.
- Strong leadership; a happily enthusiastic environment; professional, enthusiastic and committed teachers; efficient and friendly admin department and communications; the pastoral care and nurturing of the children.
- Communications especially throughout the pandemic we were kept up to date.

I would like the school to consider these areas for improvement (*a selection of the comments received*)

- After Covid restrictions- invite parents into the school who have not yet seen their child's setting.
- I'd like to see a wider range of extra-curricular activities art, sport.
- I would like more feedback about the day to day learning so i can promote learning at home better. I don't have a very good understanding of the standards/ expectations.
- Getting the homework for a term at a time needs more active management by parents to ensure it is not missed. It's not what we have been used to.
- Bring back choir when allowed perhaps a netball club or football for girls after school. To be able to use the library more.
- Parent's evening was fine online but it is nice to see the work in their books/on displays so we would be happy with online parents evenings if there was an opportunity for this. Children are very pleased to show off their work to us parents when it is on display in school. It's not quite the same as seeing it on social media although this is also nice and gives and opportunity for others (grandparents etc.) to see their work too.
- More activities/ games for the children during break time/ lunch times e.g. basketball nets/ skittles, giant dominoes.
- School meals it's hard to comment as we do not have the school dinners but potentially more varied meals with fresh ingredients i.e. a big lasagne instead of sausage roll etc...
- More insights into my child's learning. It would be useful to understand more about their development in between parents' evenings.
- Nothing moving our children to this school was the best move. Their needs have been met and they are fully supported to achieve their best and to make the right choices.

Other comments (a selection of the comments received)

- I think Elvington School and all its staff throughout the pandemic have been phenomenal and put the children's education and mental health there priority and that for me has helped my child in his last two years at Elvington and look forward to my younger son starting next year.
- Miss Palmer has been amazing in her enthusiasm, support, availability and care, not just for learning but general well-being and development as well. Mr Buttery has had an initiation by fire, but has really impressed with his tenacity and hands on approach, it has not gone unnoticed or unappreciated the impact that planning for Covid has likely had on him and maintaining a work life balance. I really hope he intends to stay with the school long term as on the positive side as a result of things like drop-off routines and so many parents doing school run due to lockdown I think this has enabled him to forge a link and relationships with pupils and parents alike that will stand him in good stead to make improvements as and when we are hopefully back to a more normal way of life and school routine.
