Admissions - Important Dates

There are a number of important dates that you need to be aware of if you are applying for a school place.

Starting Primary School

For entry in the September 2022 school year, children will have been born between 1st September 2017 and 31st August 2018. Applications for children who were born between 1st September 2018 and 31st August 2019 can be made from the Autumn of 2022.

You can apply online at www.york.gov.uk/schooladmissions from 12th September 2021. With an online application you will receive an email confirming submission of your application and the ability to view your application and results online at a later date. Please remember to submit your application by the closing date.

If you can't apply online you can request a paper Primary Application Form by calling 01904 551554.

You need to ensure that you have applied, either online (and submitted your application), or by returning a Primary Application Form by the deadline of 15th January 2022.

Key Dates for the 'Primary Round'

- 15th Jan 2022 Deadline for applications
- 16th April 2022 or the next working day National Offer Day
- 21st May 2022 Appeal forms to be returned
- June-July 2022 Admission appeals heard

Transition from Primary to Secondary

Children transfer to secondary school at the beginning of Year 7, and applications must be made in September/October of Year 6.

You can apply online at www.york.gov.uk/schooladmissions from 12th September 2021. With an online application you will receive an email confirming submission of your application and the ability to view your application and results online at a later date. Please remember to submit your application by the closing date.

You need to ensure that you have applied, either online (and submitted your application), or by returning a Secondary Application Form by the deadline of 31st October 2021.

- 1st March 2022 or the next working day National Offer Day
- 31st March 2022 Appeal forms to be returned
- May-July 2022 Admission appeals heard

Upcoming Dates

Friday 8th **October** - Harvest Festival at Holy Trinity Church. Following a discussion between the Church and School, unfortunately parents/carers will not be invited to attend this event.

Whilst we all want to get back to as normal a school day/week/month/year as possible, the prevalence of the virus in society does mean we need to proceed with caution. Wider restrictions may have relaxed, however, the virus is now approximately 30 times more prevalent than it was in September 2020.

The Department for Education stated that more than 100,000 pupils were absent from school last week after either testing positive for COVID-19 or having a suspected case of the virus. Our aim is to release internal restrictions slowly to reduce the risk of an outbreak in school.

Wednesday 20th & Thursday 21st October - Parents' Evenings. Additional details will follow in due course, however, please add these important dates to your calendars.

COVID-19

If your child has a positive COVID-19 diagnosis, or is having a test/required to self-isolate, please inform the school using the following email address, as soon as you find out: head@elvingtonprimary.org.uk. The aforementioned email address will be checked regularly (including weekends).

From 16th August 2021, children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. Instead, children will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test.













Pupils who have had a PCR test cannot return to school until they have a negative test result or have completed the required isolation time. Please note that a rapid-result lateral flow device (LFD) test will not be accepted, as these are not recommended for primary age pupils.

We must all continue to be vigilant of COVID-19 symptoms: a new continuous cough, a high temperature or the loss of taste or smell. If a child, or any member of their household, has any of these symptoms, however mild, they must not come to school and should seek a test as soon as possible by calling 119 or visiting: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid19/testing-and-tracing/get-a-test-to-check-if-you-have-coronavirus/.


Our Voice counts.... School Council
