



Class Four Newsletter

Welcome back to school and welcome to Summer Term 2015! We hope that you enjoyed your Easter break and that you are ready for the new term to begin!

This newsletter will give you a brief outline of what we will be up to in class during the Summer Term but, as always, if there is anything else you need to know just come and ask. After school is the best time to catch us as mornings can be a little bit busy!

What will we be learning about this term?

Below is a brief summary of some of the things the children will be learning about this term. You will also find a topic overview at the end of this newsletter.

English

The children will be following the National Curriculum objectives relating to their age and ability. As part of our English work we will use a class text as a focus for studying poetry, diary writing, information texts and persuasive writing. The children will have opportunities to complete some longer, sustained narrative and information writing and will develop their skills through drafting and editing their work.

Reading

Almost all of our reading in school is now done through guided reading, although there will still be some individual reading. The books are colour banded and we will continue to encourage the children to change their own books. We would encourage you to read with your child frequently as this helps them with fluency and intonation. As they progress, they will increasingly come upon vocabulary that will need explaining and this time is ideal for you to check that they understand what they have read.



Maths

As in English, the children will follow objectives from the National Curriculum, relating to their age and ability. We will have a daily focus on the Key Instant Recall Facts (K.I.R.F.s), more information about these is sent home each half-term. You can help your child at home by carrying out some of the activities on the sheet. We will also be covering place value, calculation, shape, measuring and handling data.



We would encourage you to continue using Mathletics 3 to 5 times a week. Some of our children are well on the way to achieving a Gold Certificate which is a great achievement and is celebrated in school during Friday's assembly. Mathletics certificates will be presented on Friday as well as the trophy for "Mathlete of the Week"!

Topic

The whole school topic is World War 2. We will be investigating the reasons why war broke out in 1939 and the impact upon life in Britain, with a focus on evacuees. We will use a range of primary and secondary sources to help develop our understanding and we look forward to a World War 2 street party towards the end of the Summer term.

Science

In science we will be studying the life cycle of animals and plants and the use of keys. As part of this we will look at the identification and classification of plants and animals. In human biology we will be looking in detail at the digestive system and healthy eating.

P.E.

Our P.E. days this term are Mondays (indoor P.E.) and Fridays (outdoor P.E.) We will also have football each Tuesday afternoon until the end of May. The Friday P.E. session will be taught by Mr Simms, a P.E. specialist, from Premier Sports and the focus during this session will be athletics.

It is useful for your child to keep their P.E. kit in school, especially their trainers, just in case we get any extra sessions or have to change our day. We will be going out for some sessions so make sure they have suitable clothing for inside and out.

Please could inhalers remain in your child's bag so that they can access them when needed and could all freshly pierced ears be covered with tape to protect them during the activities. Earrings must then be removed for all P.E. activities.

Who is teaching and when?

Mrs MacDonald will teach the class Monday - Thursday and Mrs Sanderson will teach every Friday, with Mr Simms teaching P.E. each Friday morning.

Homework and Spellings

Spelling homework will be set on a Monday and needs to be handed in on the following Monday. The spellings will follow a particular spelling pattern or rule and the children will be set a homework activity which relates to this. We will not test the children formally each week, which is a continued change from how we approached spellings in the Autumn and Spring Term.

Maths homework, sometimes Mathletics, will be set on Wednesday to be returned or completed by the following Wednesday.

Year 5 children will also have English homework each Friday which will need to be returned by the following Friday.

If, for whatever reason, your child has been unable to complete their homework please let us know, either by having a chat with one of us first thing in the morning or by writing a note in their planner. We can then make arrangements for completing it, either during playtimes or at home. The children can go on Mathletics as often as they like! It's great fun and wonderful for independent learning.
