Levels of Achievement

The National Curriculum sets standards of achievement in each subject for pupils aged 5 to 14. For most subjects, these standards range from Levels 1 to 8. Pupils progress up the levels as they get older and learn more:

most 7 year olds are expected to achieve Level 2b most 11 year olds are expected to achieve Level 4b most 14 year olds are expected to achieve Level 5 or 6

We are very proud to be celebrating our EYFS, Year 1, KS1 and KS2 results. These results reflect all the hard work by teachers, pupils and parents throughout their school life at Elvington. We have relatively small cohorts in school, one child can appear as 5% or more which has a big impact when comparing against national averages.
