Message from Miss Collier

One of the best things about my job is talking to and listening to our children. In particular, it gives me great insight into the work they have undertaken, which parts they have enjoyed, found challenging and relished. Often, children tell their parents that they have done "nothing" at school. This week I have therefore chosen to share with you, in the words of the children, what they have done this week.

"In Maths we have been counting to 100. We did writing about wriggly worms using our finger spaces. We get to read our work out to children. When you've done really good, you get a green dojo. In the outdoor area we have been skipping. We do numbers outside, counting up to 20 and we put the numbers in order. We don't run in the outside area. My favourite thing this week has been skipping with my friend Chloe."

Class 2

"We've been learning about trains. Today we wrote about The Rocket. It was the first locomotive designed by George Stephenson, his nickname is the 'Father of the Railway.' We've been drawing our own trains with different pencils and crayons. In our topic books, we separated the trains into steam, electric and diesel. We are also training for Times Table Rockstars; we have completed a sheet of 60 multiplication facts under 3 minutes!"

Class 3

"In the mornings we have done word searches with our spellings. We have had guided reading, one group reads with Miss Palmer and one group reads with Mrs Challis. We do dictionary tasks, acrostic poems too. We read in the Zebra group, and are reading a book called The Spiderwick Chronicles. They move to an old house, Aunt Lucy's house, which has a creature in the wall. We don't know if it's a good creature or bad creature yet! In maths, we have been doing problem solving which blows your mind. It's my favourite thing because I really like problem solving because I like a challenge."

"We've been writing a newspaper report about the splurge attacks in Bugsy Malone. We are now typing it up using the Chromebooks. We like being able to type up our work; it is more fun. We've also been doing some maths. Today we have been converting mm, cm, m, km. Our science topic is electricity and we were allowed to look at cells and wires from Fulford School to predict, test and build circuits. In topic we have also been investigating how light reflects off different objects."

"We've been doing some circuit training with Mr Walton (Jorvik Sports), including sit ups, press ups and burpees, squats and jumping. It was fun but challenging. We have been writing newspapers on Romeo and Juliet or Antony and Cleopatra. We chose Romeo and Juliet as we found it the most interesting. The best thing this week has been algebra in maths because it was challenging, and computing where we used Purple Mash to complete coding for fireworks and rockets."

After all this hard work, I am sure all our pupils and staff are ready for the bank holiday weekend. I wish you all a wonderful extended weekend.
