#### **SIAMS Inspection**

As parents and carers are aware our SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) was carried out on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2020. I would like to thank the parents and carers who met with the inspector and sent supportive emails to the school; as always this is much appreciated.

The inspection was conducted by an external inspector (as rigorously as in an OFSTED inspection). They gathered evidence and conducted interviews, then considered their judgements against specific criteria, which will then be quality assured by the National Society. I will make you aware when the report is available; this will hopefully be prior to the Easter holidays...
