Make a Lava Lamp



You will need:

- An empty bottle
- Water
- Cooking oil or baby oil
- Food colouring
- Baking Powder

Instructions:

1. Fill the container with $\frac{1}{4}$ water
2. Add the food colouring and stir
3. Fill the rest of the container with oil
4. Add baking powder, and watch your lava lamp erupt!

Phonics Booklets



