### Number: Problem Solving Outdoors

How many different ways can you add two numbers to make the number 17?

Collect 17 natural objects from outdoors. You could include pebbles, leaves or sticks. Use either two paper plates or small tubs. Place some of the objects on each plate or in the tubs. Remember to use all your natural objects. Now count how many are on each.

Can you write the calculation sentence?  
How many different ways can you make 17?

Have fun playing a game of buried treasure on phonics play.



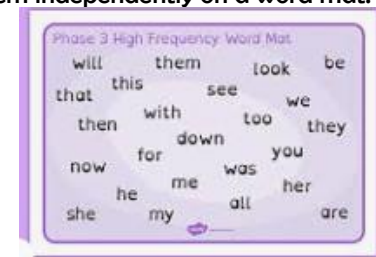
### Physical Development:

**Ice cream in a bag!**  
 Make your own ice cream



**You will need**

- 2 plastic sealable freezer bags
- ½ cup of milk or cream
- 1 tablespoon of sugar
- ¼ teaspoon of vanilla extract (optional)
- 6 tablespoons of salt
- ice

**Method**

1. Place the ice and salt into one freezer bag
2. Place the milk/cream, sugar and vanilla extract into the other freezer bag
3. Place the milk bag into the ice bag
4. Shake the bags for 5 minutes, or until the mixture has turned into ice cream!
