- Have a go at the attached maths challenges: Y4 Maths Mystery of the Royal Wedding. Remember, when dividing by 10, 100 or 1000, you can move the digits down 1, 2 or 3 places eg 8000 ÷ 1000 = 8
- Collect some data about a topic related to the theme of 'fame/ celebrity' (eg how many goals scored by different football teams this season; how many weeks different songs have spent in the top 40; number of subscribers that different children's Youtubers have) Then create a bar chart using lego. Create a scale eg for the footballers one, if the highest amount of goals was 70 you might use one of the size blocks below to represent 4 goals and a half size one to represent 2 goals. With some data, you may need to round numbers to the nearest 5, 10, 100 or 1000 depending on the size of the numbers that you are working with.
