Please don't worry if your child/ren do not have school shoes that fit them at present. I will be happy for children to wear their most appropriate footwear until the start of the summer term.

Social distancing dividers, on the pavement of our Elvington Lane entrance, are in place. If you think it would be a useful exercise, to help prepare your child/ren for the start of school, please have a walk-through and discuss what will happen on Monday 8th March.

Children should be accompanied by one adult for drop off/pick up at the allocated time to maintain social distancing. The Government recommends walking/cycling where possible. You should only bring siblings if you have no alternative options. If you do need to bring siblings they will need to be by your side and adhering to the social distancing measures we have put in place. Please be punctual for your slot; if you miss it you will need to wait until after all bubbles have been admitted as groups must not mix.

The DfE have stipulated the following in relation to attendance from Monday 8th March 2021: School attendance will be mandatory for all pupils. The usual rules on school attendance apply, including:

- Parents' duty to secure their child's regular attendance at school (where the child is a registered pupil at school and they are of compulsory school age).
- The ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices in line with local authorities' codes of conduct.

From week beginning Monday 25th January, all primary school staff have had access to twice weekly, COVID-19 self-administered lateral flow tests. Staff self-administer these tests at home and report the results after 30 minutes. This clearly presents a potential logistical challenge for parents/carers and schools, as a positive test result would lead to a bubble or bubbles closing.

If a member of staff does test positive, we may need to make a bubble closure, this information will shared with you via email. However, please be aware that this could be at very short notice. We are, of course, hopeful that we will not have to take this action.

I would like to thank you once again for the sacrifices you have made and, where possible, for keeping your child/ren at home during this period of national restrictions. I recognise that for many of you this will have been an extremely challenging time.

The entire staff team are looking forward to welcoming back all children on Monday 8th March. We will ensure that this transition back to school is as successful as possible; thank you once again for your continued support.















COVID-19 Testing

Whole families and households with primary school, secondary school and college age children, including childcare and support bubbles, will be able to test themselves twice every week from home as schools return from 8th March.




