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Mr. Buttery's Update

Summer Term Events Guidance

I have received further guidance from the DfE about events this term. However, as you will read below there is still a large degree of uncertainty; this makes planning challenging.

Can schools host leavers' assemblies in the 2020/21 summer term?

Currently, schools should avoid hosting large group gatherings such as assemblies or mass worship. The schools COVID-19 operational guidance states that children should be kept in separate, independent groups.

Leavers' assemblies in the summer term will need to be managed in line with wider government advice contained within the roadmap out of lockdown.

Will school performances and plays be able to take place in the 2020/21 summer term?

If planning an indoor or outdoor face-to-face performance in front of a live audience, you should follow the latest advice in the working safely during COVID-19 in the performing arts guidance.

If planning an outdoor performance, you should also give particular consideration to the guidance on delivering outdoor events.

As we have done throughout the pandemic, the staff at Elvington will continue to do everything we can to give the best possible educational experiences, which adhere to Governmental guidelines. We currently have the following planned:

We don't want to disappoint the children through cancelling events. As a result the bulk of our planned activities will take place outdoors or be recorded for parents/carers to access remotely.

If your child has a positive COVID-19 diagnosis, or is having a test/required to self-isolate, please inform the school using the following email address, as soon as you find out: <u>head@elvingtonprimary.org.uk</u>. The aforementioned email address will be checked regularly - seven days a week and over holidays. The school will always inform you as soon as we can if there has been a confirmed case within your child's bubble and if your son or daughter needs to isolate. However, we will never name the child/staff member who has tested positive.

We must all continue to be vigilant of COVID-19 symptoms: a new continuous cough, a high temperature or the loss of taste or smell.
