

Parents' Evenings

We are extremely pleased that all of the children have settled back into school so effectively this term, and have adapted positively to revised routines and expectations.

We will be continuing to use our online booking system for the upcoming Parents' Evenings on Wednesday 20th and Thursday 21st October. The aforementioned booking system is provided by School Jotter and will enable parents/carers to make their own bookings within the available time slots.

As these meetings will be taking place outside of standard school hours, it is my currently my intention for them to be held in school. However, in order to reduce the potential spread of COVID-19, parents/carers will be requested to wear a face covering throughout their time in school (unless medically exempt). In addition, I would like to request that a negative flow test is recorded prior to attending (lateral flow testing is a fast and simple way to test people who do not have symptoms of COVID-19, but who may still be spreading the virus). Classrooms will be well ventilated with social distancing measures in place (members of staff will also be wearing a face covering).

If you would prefer to have either a phone call or Google Meet, with your child's class teacher, this can be arranged via the school office (office@elvingtonprimary.org.uk). The aforementioned would need to take place outside standard Parents' Evening hours.

Ventilation

Windows and classroom doors (internal and external) will be left open as much as possible to aid ventilation. Elvington's teachers are continuing to plan lots of outdoor learning activities; therefore it is essential that the children come suitably dressed for all weather possibilities. This will be especially important as we head into the winter months.

Please be aware that children can wear additional clothing (fleeces or extra sweatshirts) over the top of school uniform. However, please don't feel that a branded fleece is essential.

Whilst we all want to get back to as normal a school day/week/month/year as possible, the prevalence of the virus in society does mean we need to proceed with caution. Wider restrictions may have relaxed, however, the virus is now approximately 30 times more prevalent than it was in September 2020.

COVID-19

If your child has a positive COVID-19 diagnosis, or is having a test/required to self-isolate, please inform the school using the following email address, as soon as you find out: <u>head@elvingtonprimary.org.uk</u>. The aforementioned email address will be checked regularly (including weekends).

From 16th August 2021, children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. Instead, children will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test.

Pupils who have had a PCR test cannot return to school until they have a negative test result or have completed the required isolation time. Please note that a rapid-result lateral flow device (LFD) test will not be accepted, as these are not recommended for primary age pupils.

We must all continue to be vigilant of COVID-19 symptoms: a new continuous cough, a high temperature or the loss of taste or smell. If a child, or any member of their household, has any of these symptoms, however mild, they must not come to school and should seek a test as soon as possible by calling 119 or visiting: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid19/testing-and-tracing/get-a-test-to-check-if-you-have-coronavirus/.


CLASS 1 & 2 - HELP NEEDED!
