Mr. Buttery's Update

After-school Clubs and Whole School Collective Worship

As a result of COVID-19 mitigations, after-school clubs have not taken place since early November. Although the aforementioned is regrettable, these preventative measures have allowed us to maintain high quality face-to-face education.

We are now increasingly confident that as a result of everyone's efforts in reducing the transmission of COVID-19, after-school clubs will be able to resume from week commencing Monday 28th February 2022.

Information about school based after-school clubs will be distributed later today. Please do not rely on these clubs for childcare, as they could, unfortunately, be cancelled at short notice.

It is also our current intention for whole school Collective Worship to resume after half term. The aforementioned has been facilitated via Google Meet since the start of this term.

All of this, however, is still taking place against the backdrop of the pandemic. Whilst normality is resuming to a point, there are still a number of cases in school. A huge thank you to the entire school team for all their hard work keeping school functioning at the high level it is, despite the inevitable difficulties that continue to be caused through staff and pupil absence at this time.

I've said it many times, but I feel hugely privileged to lead such a fantastic and committed staff team. Alongside your support as a community, these are the key ingredients that make Elvington Church of England Primary School the wonderful setting that it is.

Additional Bank Holiday

You will be aware that this year sees the Platinum Jubilee of the reign of Queen Elizabeth II. The Government announced it was adding a bank holiday in celebration of this event and placed it within our Summer Half Term. This means June 2nd and 3rd (Thursday and Friday) are designated bank holidays. However, unlike other bank holidays that are fixed, because this one has been added, the Government has stated that schools can set that bank holiday for a different time of year within term time.

The aforementioned additional bank holiday is designated to individual schools to set; we wished to cause as little disruption to the children's education as possible (considering the disruption that has already occurred over the past two years). To that end we have decided to place our day on **Friday 22nd July 2022.** That date was scheduled to be the last Friday of the academic year. This means our last day in school, at the end of the summer term, will now be **Thursday 21st July 2022.** Our term dates on the website will be adjusted to take account of this, however, I wanted to let you know at the first available opportunity.

Parents' Evenings

As you know our Parents' Evenings will be taking place virtually on **Tuesday 15th and Wednesday 16th February.** You should now have received a Google Meet link via email. The aforementioned link will enable you to access your appointment at the time you requested on School Jotter.

I would like to suggest that you attempt to access the meeting at some point prior to Tuesday 15th February. The meeting will not be live, however, you will know if you need to setup a free Gmail account in order to access it.



Appointments will last for ten minutes. Please do not request access before your meeting is due to start.

The focus of these meetings will be reviewing work covered during the academic year so far; discussing end of year targets; progress and wellbeing. The aforementioned meetings will take place via Google Meet; with the option of a phone call if this would be preferred.

Kingswood Meeting

Parents and Carers of children in Years 5 and 6 are invited to attend a virtual meeting on Monday 14th February at 4pm (meet.google.com/qec-tszr-umz).

At the meeting we will outline the timetable for the residential trip, which will take place between Wednesday 9th and Friday 11th March 2022. We will be available to answer any questions that you may have.

At the time of writing, I am hopeful that the residential will go ahead as planned. However, as with so many aspects of life, the visit will be subject to COVID-19 related factors.

Healthy Snacks

The school operates a healthy snacks policy whereby children choosing to bring a snack for break time should choose fresh fruit or vegetables. Children have been bringing Bear Pure Fruit Yo Yos into school, these are permitted. However, an increasing number of children are bringing predominantly chocolate based snacks into school. I would like to politely request that this stops. Our school discourages the consumption of snacks high in fat and/or sugar.

The Foundation and KS1 children receive fruit and vegetables, offered under the government initiative to provide all infants with free fruit and vegetables during the day.

COVID-19

If your child has a positive COVID-19 diagnosis, or is having a test/required to self-isolate, please inform the school using the following email address, as soon as you find out: <u>head@elvingtonprimary.org.uk</u>. The aforementioned email address will be checked regularly (including weekends).

Confirmatory PCR tests following a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test result are to be temporarily suspended from Tuesday 11th January. This will mean that anyone who receives a positive LFD test result will be required to self-isolate immediately and will not be required to take a confirmatory PCR test.

From 16th August 2021, children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, should take an LFD test every day for seven days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

Pupils who have had a positive PCR or LFT test cannot return to school until they have a negative test result or have completed the required isolation time. From Monday 17th January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation. Further information on self-isolation for those with COVID-19 is available.



Symptoms of the Omicron Variant

We have continued to have a number of confirmed cases in school this week. I would like to draw your attention towards the other symptoms widely reported for children who have tested positive for COVID-19, especially with the Omicron variant. These include:

- Fatigue .
- Diarrhoea and vomiting
- Headache •
- Other body aches (including •
- Sore or "scratchy" throat •
- Runny nose •
- Sneezing
