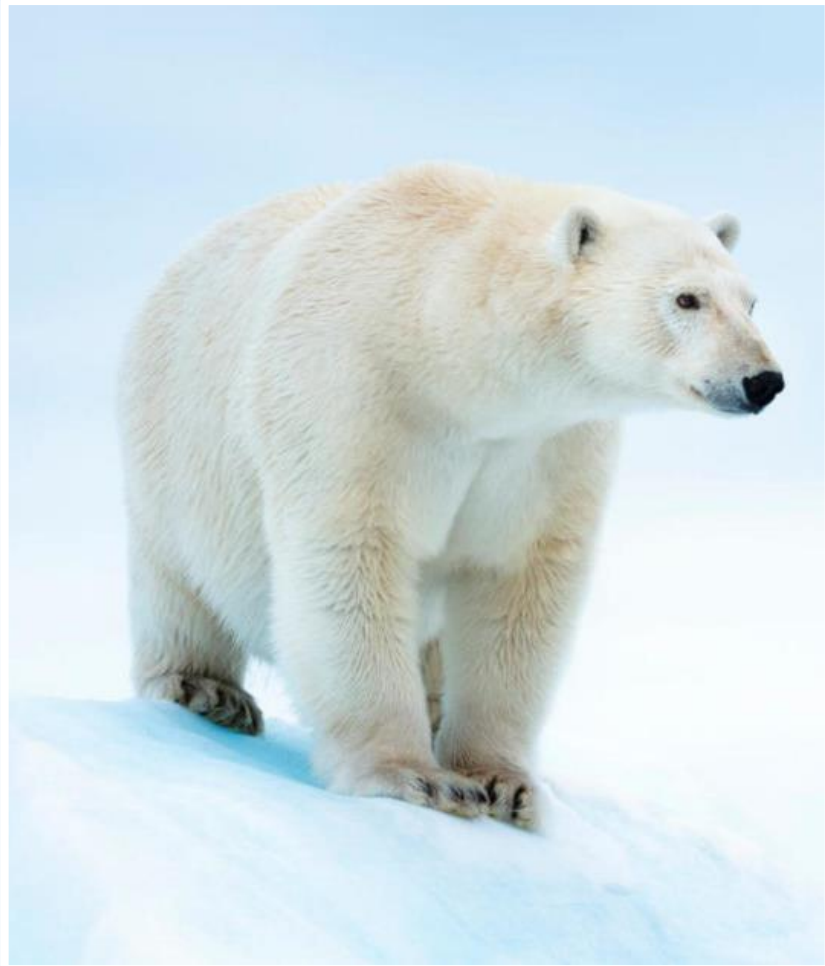

With our Forest School experts, your children will learn how to safely use tools to create something useful. The older children (Class 5 & 6) will be whittling spoons.

Class 1, 2, and 3 will be making useful things from sticks.

Hedgehog Hotel Building/Bug Huts - for the School Science Garden



How to build a bug hotel



You will need:

- Wooden pallets x4
- Bricks
- Plastic bottles
- Bamboo canes
- Straw
- Leaves
- Tiles
- Cardboard
- Stones/pebbles
- Twigs/loose bark

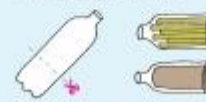
1 Place a wooden pallet in your chosen location. On top of the pallet, line bricks around the corners and across the middle.



2 Place your next pallet on top of this and repeat the process for all of your pallets.



3 Cut off the top two-thirds of your bottles. Fill up half of them with bamboo canes/straw and the other half with rolled up cardboard. Place these inside the hotel.



4 Fill in the remaining spaces with bricks, leaves, pebbles, stones, tiles, loose bark and straw.



5 Add in any extra materials that you want to recycle e.g. old pipes, carpeting, toilet tubes, old plant pots. Be creative - add a welcome sign or give your hotel a name!



*Use old plastic bottles for this and always recycle after use.



Bee Bomb Creation for the School Science Garden

Make Your Own Seed Bombs

Seed bombs are a great way to plant wildflower seeds in your garden or outdoor area. As well as adding splashes of colour they also provide essential food for a range of insects.

You will need:

- 1 cup of wildflower seeds (you could collect your own!)
- 2 cups of peat-free compost
- 5 cups of powdered clay (or use clay soil)
- 1-2 cups of water
- a large bowl to mix the seed bombs

How to make a seed bomb:

- 1 Add the clay, compost, seeds and water to your mixing bowl.
- 2 Use your hands or a stick to mix everything together. Add more water if needed. Make sure that the seeds are evenly spread throughout the mixture.
- 3 Use your hands to roll the mixture into five balls about the size of a golf ball.
- 4 Place the seed bombs onto a tray and leave them to dry in the sun.
- 5 Store the seed bombs in a cardboard box until they are ready to use.

How to plant your seed bombs:

Simply throw your seed bombs onto some bare soil in a sunny spot in your garden or an outdoor area. The best time to plant seed bombs are in early spring or early autumn when they will get some rain. Wait and see what flowers grow!

Our STAR Barn will be opened by our local celebrities Sweetie and Cornel- thank you to York Maze!

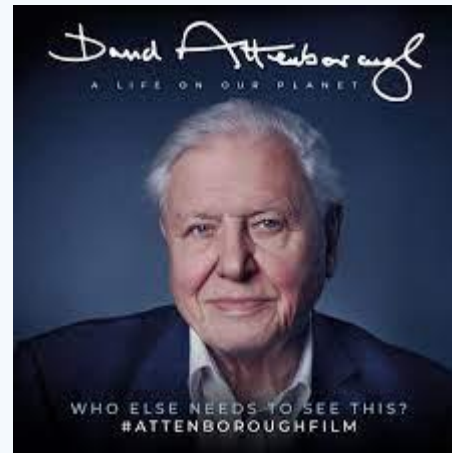


We are hoping to welcome Look North and Blue Peter to our event...
