Introduction



ASCEL (The Association of Senior Children's and Education Librarians) Yorkshire and Humber branch have worked together across the region, supported by Arts Council Funding to bring you this second festival of visual literacy. The first festival took place in 2018 and the 2022 festival builds and on this success but also addresses concerns about the impact of the pandemic on children's learning and mental wellbeing.

Working with visual and creative artists and key partners of book illustrators Reading Pictures Seeing Stories will give children and young people this opportunity to meet and learn from illustrators and artists and to explore the connection between literacy and the visual arts and offer children and families not usually engaged with arts the chance to discover the power of pictures. We also hope through work with schools to help narrow the gap in children's reading ability, caused by the pandemic. We want to get arty, have creative fun and encourage children to use the library to access a world of books. Visual literacy is the ability to see understand and interpret images, much as literacy is the ability to read and deprive meaning from texts. Visual literacy is an important skill for understanding visual media that can lead to enhanced performance of other intellectual tasks and builds the ability to interpret and evaluate information and messages. From an early age children draw from their everyday observations of the world around them in order to learn. In todays visually saturated environment they must develop the skills to decode, think critically and communicate the images around them. The ability to read images can help young people to navigate and make sense of their world.

The founder and artistic director of Salma's Bollywood Academy, she has appeared on Coronation Street, BBC1, BBC2, BBC3, ITV and Channel 4, and has choreographed and performed for Bollywood stars. Salma is an ambassador for several high-profile charities, including a global ambassador for the ambassador's foundation in America.

Salma is the author of 'Bollywood Princess,' 'HELP! I Can't Dance Without My Bhangra Pants' Greedy Gertie and Sally and her Super Snot which is part of 'The Sensational Super Children Series'. She is also a qualified dance and drama teacher who embeds dance choreography, movements and gestures within her children';s books. Salma teaches many styles, including traditional and cultural South Asian dances ranging from Bollywood, Bhangra and Lollywood dance.

Salma won the 'Yorkshire Women of Achievement Awards'– Arts Category – 2018/2019 and she was awarded the 'Best Dancing School' for 2018 and the best inclusive 'Dancing School' for 2019.

"In my drawing sessions, families explore book characters through funny shapes like potatoes, carrots, baked beans and toast! Not all of them are food related but they do help us to stop worrying and start creating some amazing artwork. Illustrator/authors start with little scribbly sketches on bits of paper, then we draw them over and over again until we get our characters right, then we think about storyboards and words. I bring my animal story characters to life by adding colour, action lines, different expressions even clothing!

Martin Impey has been a freelance illustrator since 1991. His published children's books include the multi award winning WW1 Poppies Series for children, including Where The Poppies Now Grow, The Christmas Truce, Flo of the Somme & Peace Lily with award winning author Hilary Robinson. He has won numerous awards including The Historical Association Young Quills Award in 2016 and shortlisted twice for the Kate Greenway Medal.

He recent books have been widely received with critical acclaim - Dulce et Decorum Est illustrating Wilfred Owen's masterpiece and Where Once We Stood a collaboration with BAFTA and Emmy nominated film maker and author Prof Christopher Riley to tell the story of the Apollo Astronauts living and working on the lunar surface.



Kirklees Libraries will be working with an illustrator to deliver closed sessions with early years settings across the authority. We will deliver quality work with groups of children of a similar age, especially those who live in an area where there isn't a library close by. We'll also be partnering with our 50 Things to do Before You're Five team.

We decided to focus our Reading Pictures Seeing Stories activities on early years as this is an age group which met with a lot of challenge even before lockdown. The most disadvantaged 5 year olds can be 19 months behind more affluent children in vocabulary development when they start school.

In Kirklees, Librarians have identified a need for support from parents and early years settings in developing strategies for introducing children to books and storytelling. And our work as a Library of Sanctuary has shown us how illustrations can bring a story to life for children for whom English is a second language.


