EYFS:

86% of pupils achieved a good level of development in 2023 (Local Authority 69.6% (2023) and national 65.2% 2022) +21% when compared to national.

Phonics screening:

76% of pupils passed the phonics test (Local Authority 76.1% and national 75% 2022) +1% when compared to national.

Year 2:

Reading - attaining EXS or better 86% in 2023 (local 68.9% (2023) and national 67.1% 2022) +19% when compared to national.

Writing - attaining EXS or better 86% in 2023 (local 61.1% (2023) and national 57.8% 2022) +28% when compared to national.

Maths - attaining EXS or better 93% in 2023 (local 70.7% (2023) and national 67.8% 2022) +25% when compared to national.

Reading, writing and maths combined - attaining EXS or better 86% in 2023 (local 54.7% (2022) and national 53.2% 2022) +33% when compared to national.

Higher Standard at Year 2:

Reading – 50% (national 18.1% 2022) +32% when compared to national.

Writing – 36% (national 8% 2022) +28% when compared to national.

Maths -50% (national 15.2% 2022) +35% when compared to national.

Reading, writing & maths combined – 21% (national 6% 2022) +15% when compared to national.

Year 6:

Reading - achieved standard 86% in 2023 (local 78.9% (2022) and national 73% 2023) +13% when compared to national.

Writing - achieved standard 93% in 2023 (local 73.7% (2022) and national 71% 2023) +22% when compared to national.

Maths - achieved standard 93% in 2023 (local 76.2% (2022) and national 73% 2023) +20% when compared to national.

Grammar, punctuation & spelling - achieved standard 86% in 2023 (local 73.5% (2022) and national 72% 2023) +14% when compared to national.

Reading, writing and maths combined - achieved standard 86% in 2023 (local 64.1% (2022) and national 59% 2023) +27% when compared to national. The Department for Education considers meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths to be key for success in secondary school and beyond.

Higher Standard at Year 6:

Reading – 57% (national 27.7% 2022) +29% when compared to national in 2022.

Writing -57% (national 12.9% 2022) +44% when compared to national in 2022.

Maths -36% (national 22.4% 2022) +14% when compared to national in 2022.

Grammar, punctuation & spelling – 50% (national 28.3% 2022) +22% when compared to national in 2022.
