## How can you continue to help at home?

Thank you for your continued support with the children's times tables. We see a clear link between children working confidently in maths and children who know their times tables. We will continue to work on times tables in class but here is how you can help at home:
*Regular counting in $6 s, 7 s, 8 s, 9 s, 12 s \quad *$ Regular use of Times Table Rock Stars *Weekly times table test practice
*Regular recall of the trickier times tables (eg $7 \times 8=56 \quad 6 \times 7=42 \quad 8 \times 9=72 \quad 12 \times 12=144 \quad 12 \times 7=84$ )

We have been really impressed with the children's enthusiasm towards their reading bingo charts. A reminder that these can be found in the back of your child's planner. The aim is to encourage reading widely across a range of genres. Wider reading improves children's fluency, comprehension, understanding of text types, vocabulary and punctuation.

Science
We will be investigating living things and their habitats within the rainforest. We will be looking at how they can be classified and how environmental changes can sometimes pose danger.

Key question: How do people celebrate key festivals? We will learn about Easter, Diwali and Ramadan.
