How can you help at home?

Reading - Please encourage your child to tell a story from the pictures within their reading book. This should be for no longer than 5 minutes each evening. After reading, please record this in your child's planner. This could just be a 'well done' and the page your child will be on next.

Phonics- A phonics task will be given once a week linking to the sounds/words we are focusing on in class. You will also receive a pack to place your child's flashcards in as they receive a new set each week. Phonics homework and the flashcard pack will be given out each Friday and should be returned a week later.

Homework book- Your child will be provided with a "Homework Book". This half term, there will be a grid of tasks linking to the topic "Elvington and the Chocolate Story" covering a range of curricular areas. Each week, your child should try to do one task from the grid and return it to school by the following **Thursday** to be marked. **Compulsory activities are highlighted in purple and should be handed in on the date specified.**

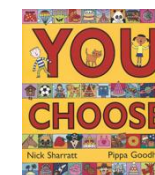

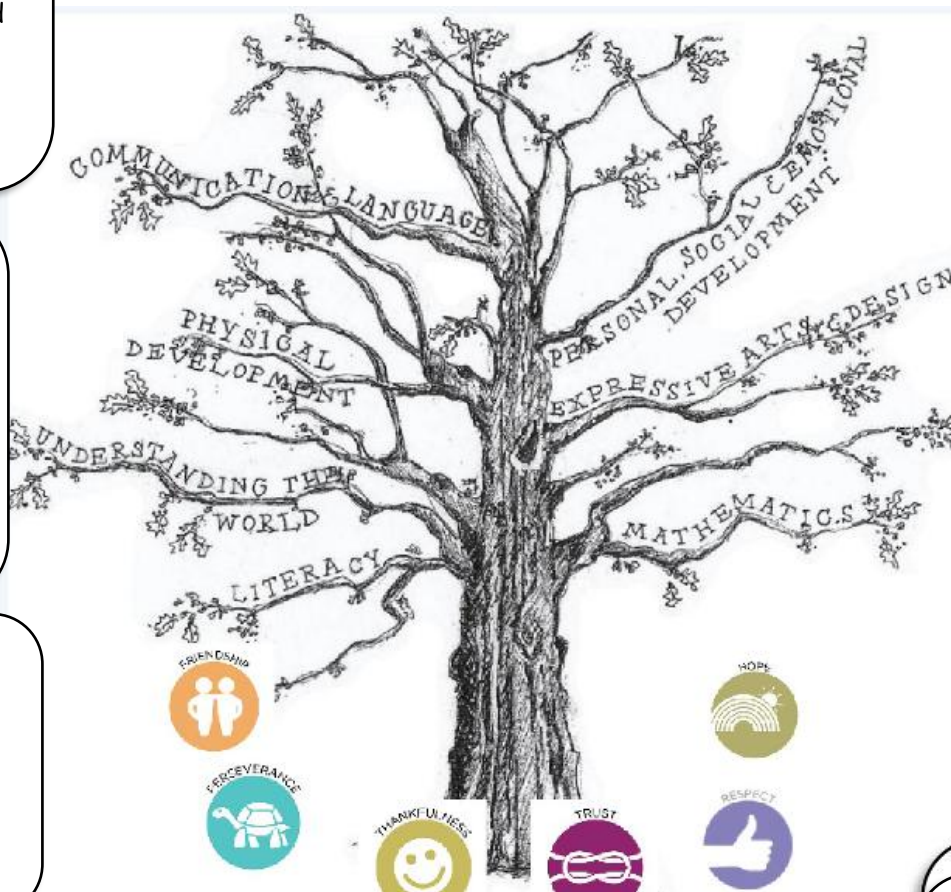
