



**Class 3 Homework Spring Term (2nd half) Topic: Along the Amazon**

Plot eggs in specific places and then write down their co-ordinates. <p><b><u>Skim a Stone</u></b></p> <p>If you visit the sea or a lake you could find a flat stone and learn to skim it across the water, (obviously avoiding any wildlife, people or boats!) How many jumps can the stone do? (Taken from 50 things to do before you're 11<math>\frac{3}{4}</math> from the National Trust).</p> 	<p><b><u>Just for fun</u></b></p>  <p>Create your own wordsearch using words that are related to the Amazon Rainforest. Challenge a grown up to solve it.</p>	<p><b><u>Physical Activity</u></b></p>  <p>Improve your ball skills. Throw and catch accurately. Can you try different ways of throwing and catching your ball? You could bounce it too. Work with an adult or an older sibling to become more accurate in throwing and catching.</p>
