WHAT IS PHONICS?



- ❖ Children are taught to read by breaking down words into separate sounds or 'phonemes'. They are then taught how to blend these sounds together to read and write the whole word.
- ❖ Phonics is taught for 30 minutes a day. In EYFS, we build from 10 minute lessons beginning in week 3 to the full length lesson of 30 minutes as we progress through the year.



LITTLE WANDLE SCHEME



- ❖ Elvington has chosen *Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised* as our systematic, synthetic phonics (SSP) programme to teach early reading and spelling.

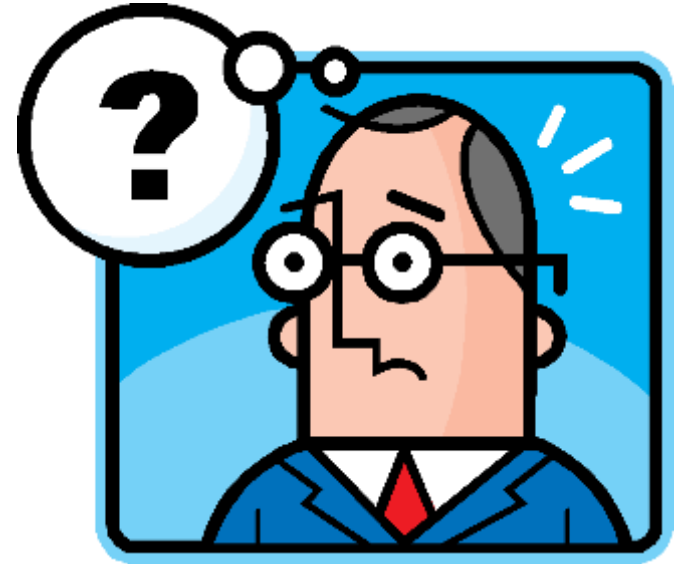

Phase 5 - split digraphs and alternative sounds

WHY DO THE CHILDREN COMPLETE THE SCREENING?

- ❖ The aim of the check is to ensure that all children are able to read by the end of year two.
- ❖ This 'midpoint check' will ensure that we have a clear understanding of what the children need to learn in year 2 to ensure they do not fall behind.



PHONICS SCREENING CHECK

- There will be two sections in this 40-word check and it will assess their phonics skills and knowledge.
- There will be 8 practice words at the start.
- Your child will read up to four words per page to their teacher. There will be 20 real words and 20 'alien words'

WHO WILL COMPLETE THE CHECK?

- ❖ The children will complete the check one at a time in a quiet area of school.
- ❖ Miss Palmer will conduct all of the screening tests with the children.
- ❖ We will make it as low-key as possible - the children will not be informed it's a "test" - it only takes 5/10 minutes.

WHEN WILL THE SCREENING TAKE PLACE?



- ❖ The phonics screening will take place during June.
- ❖ If your child does not pass the phonics screening, they will be given extra Phonics support in school and re-checked in Year 2.
