We are very proud to be able to share with you our end of key stage data for the academic year 2025-26. Our children have achieved wonderful results throughout school.

In recent years, Governmental changes have resulted in heightened expectations throughout all primary schools. Elvington's staff team have worked incredibly hard to quickly adapt to such changes and to ensure we always uphold the highest of expectations. As a result of continual hard work and relentless improvement, our children have achieved exceptionally high standards (despite the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic). EYFS:

93% of pupils achieved a good level of development in 2025 (Local Authority 73.6% 2026) and national 72.3% 2025) **+21%** when compared to national

Phonics screening:

100% of pupils passed the phonics test (Local Authority 82.8% and national 81.8% 2026) **+18.2%** when compared to national

Year 6:

Reading - average scaled score 109.2 in 2026 (national 105.7 2026) **+3.5** when compared to national

Reading - achieved standard 81.3% in 2026 (local 75% (2026) and national 75% 2026) **+6.3%** when compared to national

Writing - achieved standard 87.5% in 2026 (local 73.9% (2026) and national 73.1% 2026) **+14.4%** when compared to national

Maths - average scaled score 106 in 202 (national 105.2 2026) **+1.1** when compared to national

Maths - achieved standard 75% in 2026 (local 74.6% (2026) and national 75% 2026) $\equiv$ when compared to national

Grammar, punctuation & spelling - average scaled score 106.4 in 2026 (national 105.4 2026) **+1** when compared to national

Grammar, punctuation & spelling - achieved standard 81.3% in 2026 (local 74.4% 2026) and national 73.7% 2026) **+7.6%** when compared to national

Reading, writing and maths combined - achieved standard 68.8% in 2026 (local 63.8% 2026) and national 63.2% (2026) **+5.6%** when compared to national.

It is important to note that one pupil with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) was disapplied from all KS2 statutory assessments; a further pupil was absent for the entirety of the assessment period. Consequently, before the outcomes of the remaining pupils were taken into account, these two pupils represented an automatic reduction of **13 percentage points** within the cohort's reported attainment data.
